Goal 1: Student Performance

- Improve student performance for ALL students through an intense focus on enhancing the teaching and learning experience throughout the District



Goal 1: Student Performance

Improve teaching and learning through a focus on
Curriculum

- Elementary curricula were revised to align with state and common core standards using the Understanding by Design framework.
- Secondary curricula was further refined by infusing literacy strands (reading/writing) through all content area
- On-going development of assessments and refinement of lessons and units of study upon implementation in the classroom
- New elementary environmental program was launched through a partnership with Ramapo college. The off-site visits to the district environmental center are complete and now students are continuing their environmental studies using their school's ecosystems

Goal 1: Student Performance

Improve teaching and learning through a focus on Evaluation

- Convened District Evaluation Advisory Committee (DEAC) to review and recommend an evaluation system for use with educators and school leaders as required by the NJDOE
- DEAC reviewed NJDOE approved models, participated in webinars, and viewed presentations prior to making final recommendation to move forward with the Stronge Evaluation System
- Board approved Stronge Evaluation System in December for September 2013
- Last week, all administrators and teachers participated in Day 1 of training on the new system

Goal 1: Student Performance

Improve teaching and learning through a focus on
Professional Development

- Summer: learning continued for teachers and administrators in the area of Readers/Writers Workshop for many middle school Language Arts teachers, formative assessment through the use of student response systems (clickers) at the middle level, and administrative institute for all district administrators that addressed topics that included communications, legal update in special education, HIB/sensitivity, and curriculum articulation.
- School year: on-going focus on common core standards driven instruction, literacy throughout all grade levels, and providing job embedded opportunities for PD in the workshop models for reading and writing.

Goal 2: Communications

- Improve communication among all members of the Wayne school district in order to share important information about the school district in a way that is timely, meaningful, and responsive to the needs of the community



Goal 2: Communications

Improve communication so that it is timely, meaningful, and responsive to the needs of the community

- Increased quality and quantity of content posted to the district website
- Expansion of the parent portal continued into the summer and through the fall resulting in over 94% families with registered emails, thus enabling:
 - On-line access to student demographic, attendance, scheduling and marking period grade information
 - Alternative means of communication between school, district, and homes
- Implemented e-notices to replace backpack paper notices by posting/archiving community flyers on the website and recently introducing a weekly email sent with a summary of all notices

Goal 2: Communications

Improve communication so that it is timely, meaningful, and responsive to the needs of the community

- Administered parent perceptions survey and collected over 1400 responses. The data are being synthesized and a summary will be posted to the district website.
- Increasing use of social media with over 650 Likes on Facebook and 542 Followers on Twitter which includes posts regarding school/district events, highlights of things happening in our class, and sharing vital information (example: Hurricane Sandy)
- Presented information regarding district initiatives using the first board meeting of the month to promote discussion
- Increased proactive and positive print and digital media presence



Goal 3: Operations

- To effectively and efficiently use district resources to provide safe, healthy, supportive environments that support educational initiatives and provide accountability for outcomes



Goal 3: Operations

Effectively and efficiently use district resources

- Near perfect audit resulting in only 1 finding for 2011-12 as reported in December
- Completed capital projects include:
 - Installation of new gym floor at Randall Carter, upgrade of clock/intercom/phone systems at APT and JFK, replacement of lockers at Schuyler, ADA compliant upgrades at 50 Nellis, asphalt paving work completed throughout the district through shared services, consolidation of “white house” location
- Implemented micro fiber and eco-friendly cleaning processes

Goal 3: Operations

Effectively and efficiently use district resources

- Established standard operating procedures (SOP) for all aspects of operation within the business office. Additional SOPs are being created for other administrative functions in the areas of HR and curriculum and instruction
- Rebuilt position control management within the district in order to oversee staffing in all schools and departments to track movement within the district and restrict hiring of staff unless an open position exists
- Introduced district wellness program beginning with on-site clinics that allowed staff to register for blood panel screening, BMI assessment, etc.

- To increase the use of technology for the purpose of improving the effectiveness and efficiency of achieving all other District Goals



Goal 4: Technology

Increase technology for the purpose of achieving all other goals

- Installed Wi-Fi access points in all district schools' main offices and media centers for a total of approximately 17% wireless coverage throughout the district
- Updated transportation software system in order to analyze and modify bus routes for greater efficiency
- Expanded functionality within parent portal in order to capture, store, and send elementary marking period data to parents
- Continued expansion of paperless options for communicating and sharing information including the implementation of a staff newsletter

Goal 4: Technology

Increase technology for the purpose of achieving all other goals

- Introduced iPads and other portable technologies throughout district schools (1 cart / elementary, 2 / middle, and 2 / high schools) to support the use of 21st century innovative teaching strategies in the classrooms and administrative uses related to new educator evaluation system
- Expanded the use of web 2.0 tools for instructional purposes such as EdModo and YouTube in order to promote greater levels of student engagement through targeted professional development

Goal 4: Technology

Increase technology for the purpose of achieving all other goals

- Utilize Google Apps to improve data collection, collaboration, and sharing of information for administrative purposes that were previously non-existent or in efficient
- Installed new point of sale system in school cafeterias in order to allow for parents to make on-line payments and view their child's meal purchases
- Utilize remote access options for delivering professional development on-line using Adobe Connect
