

UPDATED K-12 GUIDANCE (8/15/22)

COVID-19 Notification and Attestation

While CDC no longer recommends individual case investigation and contact tracing, it is possible for your child to become exposed to COVID-19 while at school or school related activities. We encourage you to watch for any symptoms of COVID-19 in your child. If your child develops any symptoms of COVID-19, contact your child's doctor for evaluation and/or testing, and keep your child home from school, childcare, and activities.

Symptoms could include any of the following:

Fever of 100.4°F / 38°C or higher	Fatigue	Sore Throat
New or worsening cough	Muscle Pain or Body Aches	Congestion or Runny Nose
Shortness of Breath/Difficulty Breathing	Headache	Nausea or Vomiting
Chills	New Taste or Smell Disorder	Diarrhea

Any positive COVID-19 test result or any COVID-19 compatible symptoms are to be reported to the School Nurse.

If you have direct knowledge that your child has been exposed to a positive case of COVID-19 (< 6 feet for >15 minutes over a 24 hour period), regardless of vaccination status, your child may attend school wearing a mask for 10 days from the date of last exposure to the virus.

In order to help protect eligible people from getting severely ill with COVID-19, the CDC and NJDOH advise staying up to date with recommended doses of COVID-19 vaccinations.
