### What is the Law?

New Jersey's "Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act" defines "Harassment, Intimidation, or Bullying" as any gesture, written, verbal or physical act, or any electronic communication, which refers to a target student on the basis of:

- ♦ Race
- ♦ Color
- ♦ Religion
- ♦ Ancestry
- ♦ National Origin
- ♦ Gender
- ♦ Sexual Orientation
- Gender Identity & Expression
- Mental, Physical, Sensory Disability
- Or by any other
  Distinguishing Characteristic

## And

 Substantially disrupts or interferes with the orderly operation of the school or the rights of other students

### And

 Physically or emotionally harms students, insults or demeans a student or creates a hostile educational environment Our vision is that Wayne Township Public Schools will be places that promote productive learning environments and positive school climates where all children feel socially, emotionally and physically safe.



# Possible signs that a student is being bullied:

- Lost or destroyed clothing, books, or electronics
- Frequently feeling sick or faking illness
- Change in eating habits
- Sleeping difficulty/frequent nightmares
- Loss of interest in school or grades
- Declining grades
- Sudden loss of friends
- Avoidance of social situations
- Decreased self-esteem
- Feeling of helplessness
- Exhibits self-destructive behaviors

# Possible signs that a student is bullying others:

- Frequently in physical or verbal fights
- Increasingly aggressive
- Have friends who bully others
- Increase in school discipline issues
- Unexplained extra money or new belongings
- Doesn't accept responsibility for his or her actions
- Are competitive and worried about reputation or popularity
